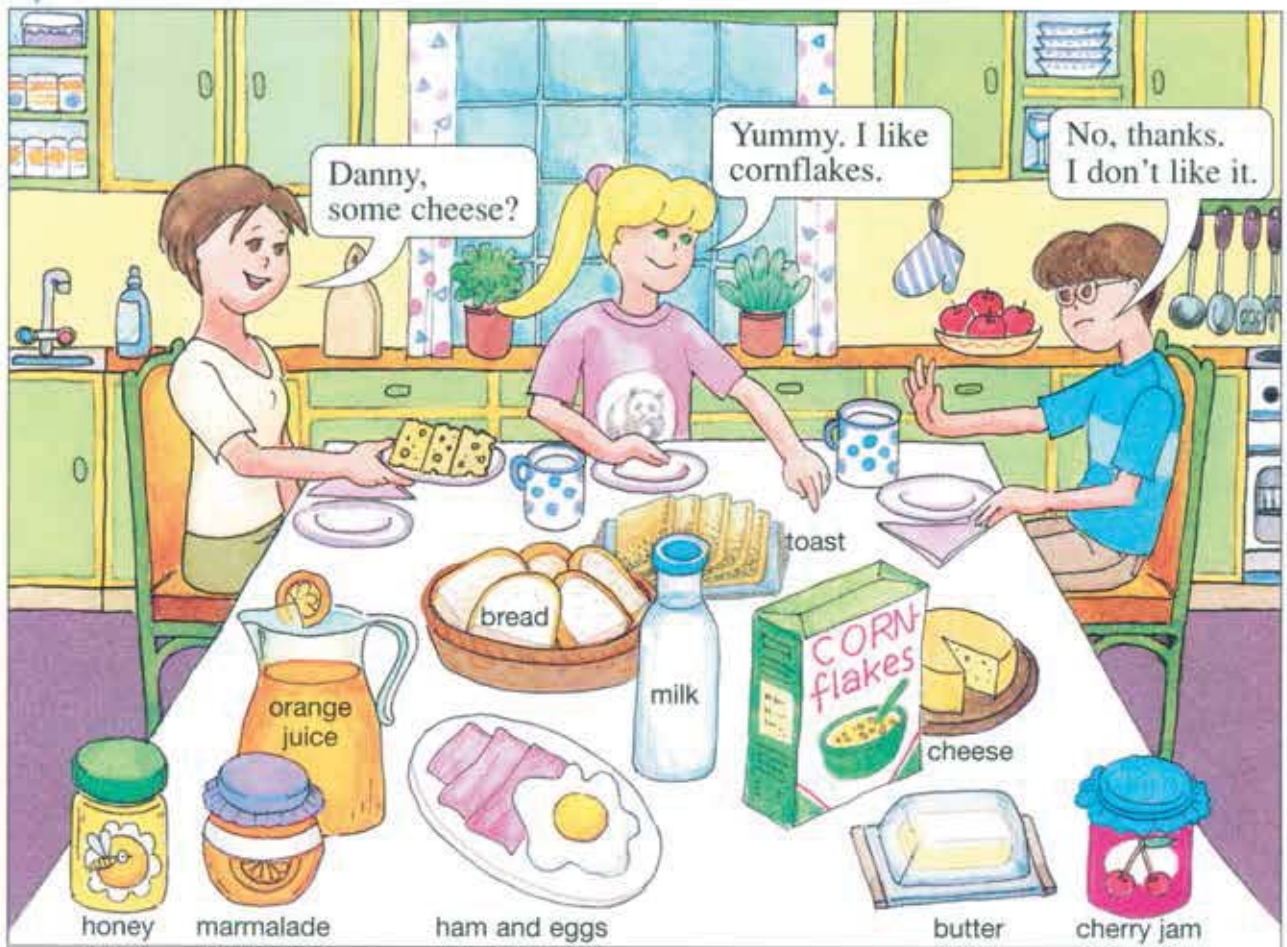

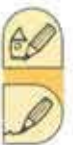

Daniel Let's play catch. You are it!



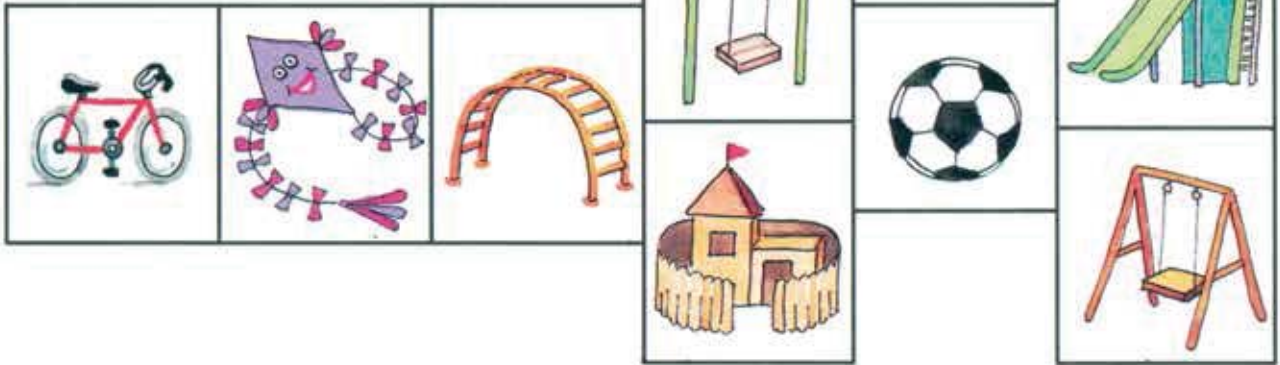
